Students are required to follow uniform guidelines. We are experiencing infractions with sock color. Please read uniform policy! Uniform infractions will be enforced. Students will be assigned to Wednesday detention and not allowed to participate in free dress days if they do not comply with the uniform guidelines. A copy of the uniform policy is included in the Wednesday folder. Only certain shirt colors and certain short/pant styles are permitted. Please refer to the guidelines for appropriate dress.

Quick Uniform Check:

- MONDAY: students can wear any St. Mary t-shirt and jeans or jean shorts (months shorts are permitted). Jeans/jean shorts must follow uniform rules with length etc.
- TUESDAY: "when" the student earns free dress (lunches, participation in fundraisers, etc.) it will be on Tuesdays. Please look for these days listed on your monthly calendar that will be sent home in your Wednesday envelope. Other Tuesdays will be uniform days.
- WEDNESDAY: regular uniform
- THURSDAY: regular uniform
- FRIDAY: dark blue- light blue combo day. Students will wear their light blue/navy polo and uniform shorts or pants. The students will have All School Mass on Friday morning and it is nice to look out and see all the kids in a sea of blue.

Clarification on Free Dress: Students are permitted to wear regular clothing on free dress days. It is our goal for the students to earn and enjoy the work put into earning free dress.

Free dress must follow uniform guidelines regarding:

- Type of shorts or pants (appropriate blue jeans may be worn), no cargo shorts or cargo pants, no yoga pants, no sweat pants, no pants or shorts with tears.
- Length of shorts must meet uniform guidelines.
- Length of skirt must meet uniform guidelines.
- Appropriate shirts/ t-shirts may be worn. Shirts do not have to match uniform colors or style. Tank tops or sleeveless shirts are not permitted.
- Sandals or open-toed shoes are not permitted to be worn to school. This is a safety issue.
- No hoodies are permitted to be worn. This is a safety issue.
- Loud bright color socks/tights are not permitted. There will be fun days that I will allow loud or bright tights and socks, this will be announced in advance.
